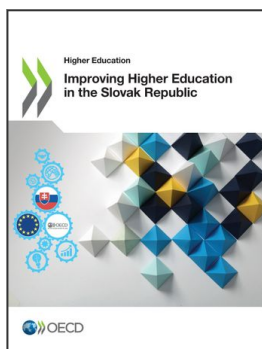


Annex B. Participating stakeholder organisations
